The Regular Meeting of the Hall County Airport Authority (HCAA) Board was held at Home Federal Bank located at 3311 Stolley Park Road, Grand Island, Nebraska 68803 on October 8, 2014.  64 Mr. Olson reported on the legislative issues conveyed from the Rural Air Service Alliance (RASA). Last
 65 week the Department of Transportation (DOT) finalized the Enforcement Policy regarding the \$200 per
 66 passenger subsidy cap. All communities within 210 miles of the nearest large or medium hub airport
 67 receiving subsidized air service under the Essential Air Service (EAS) program have until September 30,
 68 2015, based on data from October 1, 2014, through September 30, 2015, to ensure compliance with the
 69 \$200 subsidy cap or face termination of subsidy eligibility. This Enforcement policy was put in place in
 70 1990, and was made permanent in 2000. Even though the policy has rarely been enforced, the DOT is
 71 going to start enforcing policy. It will be interesting how this policy will affect Kearney and Scottsbluff
 72 airports.

74 Operations Report by Operations Manager/Security Coordinator Doug Brown:

- 75 • Provided Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting (ARFF)/Direct Ramp Observation (DRO) for Allegiant
- 76 flights, Korean Hero Flight departing on September 29th and returning on October 1st, a Charter
- 77 flight on October 17th, and provided ARFF for American Eagle daily flights.
- 78 • Conducted monthly ARFF drills and weekly training held on Part 139 Training, Safety, and
- 79 Transportation Security Administration procedures.
- 80 • Continuous mowing.
- 81 • Painted administration offices and installed cabinets in Building 116B (HCAA Administration).
- 82 • Installed directional sign on Sky Park Road to Hall County Airport Authority Administration Offices
- 83 in Building 116B.

- 84 • Poured concrete to relocate tenant mail box clusters. Mail boxes will be located on the north end
- 85 of the parking lot near Building A (TSA office).
- 86 • Repaired leaking roof in Building 850 (CMG Enterprise LLC).
- 87 • Repaired overhead door on Building 129 (Maintenance) and Building 853 (Gro-Rite).
- 88 • Repaired outlets and lights in Building 710 (FedEx).
- 89 • Painted Building 90 (Electrical Vault).
- 90 • Cleared items out of Building 106 (Fire Station) to make way for tenant Civil Air Patrol to move in.
- 91 • Continue with repairs/requirements to Building A (TSA office).
- 92 • Replaced gutter on Building 700A (Lamar).
- 93 • Relocated HCAA staff parking signs to Building 116B (HCAA Administration).
- 94 • Updating Airport Security Plan, Airport Certification Manual, and Airport Emergency Plan.
- 95 • Numerous other daily projects completed and scheduled.

97 Construction & Planning Report. Executive Director reported asbestos abatement in the Administration &
98 Radar buildings needs to be completed, and the Federal Aviation Administration cables relocated before
99 the notice to proceed can be issued for the construction of the passenger terminal. The detention cells east
100 of the west parking lot are holding water so vertical French drains will be installed in both cells to alleviate
101 the problem. The water line and fire hydrant by the 5-Unit hanger have been installed and chlorinated. The
102 first two water tests failed and the city in the process of re-chlorinating and retesting water.

103
104 Chief Construction will begin construction of the General Aviation Terminal in March 2015. Chief will install
105 fence and temporary gate around construction site.

175 b) The Korean War Hero Flight to Washington, DC departed from the Central Nebraska Regional
176 Airport on Monday, September 29, 2014 and returned Wednesday, October 1, 2014. Upon return,
177 veterans were welcomed by the Grand Island Senior High Air Force Junior ROTC and soldiers from
178 the Army Aviation Support Facility, while the Northwest High School Band played a medley of U.S.
179 Armed Service branch songs. A large American flag was hoisted high on the ladder from the Grand
180 Island Fire truck and served as a backdrop for the water cannon salute staged by the Authority's
181 fire trucks. Mr. Olson commended staff for all their efforts in making this a huge success.

183 October 17, 2014.
184 d) A Ground Breaking Ceremony for the new passenger terminal is scheduled for October 29, 2014

217 *and on behalf of the Authority any and all documents, certificates and questionnaires necessary or*
218 *appropriate for the Authority to participate in the Initiative including, without limitation, an agreement with*
219 *the Commission under the terms set forth in the Initiative. Upon roll call, motion was approved with a 4-0*
220 *vote.*
